




### 2024 ANNUAL REPORT

We've seen more and more families come to us for far more than just food and clothing assistance. That's why, with your support, we launched our highly anticipated Mission: NOVA expansion in Northern Virginia in August 2024.

Through this new location, combined with our Comprehensive Family Resource Center (CFRC), local families have a one-stop location where they can receive food and clothing, as well as access to job training opportunities, social workers, parenting classes, addiction support, English language classes, legal aid, assistance with housing placement, Bible studies, medical care and so much more.

Every service offered at our centers is designed to strategically solve the core issues that keep people in poverty and homelessness.

Together, we served more than 67,479 people at the CFRC and with our partner ministries. An impact like that is possible only with help from you and other compassionate people in our community. Thank you for your faithful generosity!
